Course Overview

This unit is a mandatory component for drivers applying for a **Dangerous Goods Licence** through **Queensland Transport**. It provides participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to safely **identify**, **handle**, **and transport dangerous goods by road** in accordance with state and national regulatory frameworks.

Topics include **labelling and placarding**, **risk assessment**, **vehicle placarding**, **load restraint**, and **emergency procedures**, as well as application of the **Australian Dangerous Goods (ADG) Code**.

✓ This course must be completed within 6 months prior to applying for a Queensland Dangerous Goods Driver Licence.

Entry Requirements

To enrol, participants must:

- Be 17 years of age or older
- Have a valid USI (Unique Student Identifier) Apply here
- Provide three (3) original forms of ID (see Student Handbook for EOI details)
- Wear closed-in footwear
- Successfully complete a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment

Queensland Transport also requires the following for licence application (external to this course):

- Satisfactory driver history and criminal history check
- Valid driver licence
- Medical certificate signed by a registered practitioner
- Queensland residency
- have completed an approved dangerous goods driver training course no later than 6 months before you apply

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Learning Outcomes

This Unit will provide the learner with the following skills:

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Understand and apply basic knowledge of the ADG Code
- Recognise and interpret dangerous goods documentation
- Correctly identify, label, and placard dangerous goods
- Select appropriate safety equipment and PPE
- **Modify procedures** based on varying risk environments
- Follow emergency procedures in the event of an accident
- Secure and restrain loads safely during transport
- Plan compliant transport routes and appropriate rest stops
- Accurately complete and amend consignment/manifest documentation

Assessment & Certification

- Practical knowledge checks
- Trainer-led review and verification

Evidence of Identity

At least one category A document must be photographic and show a full name and date of birth (DOB)

A candidate must produce, and an assessor must sight, three matching, original, evidence of identity (EOI) documents before undertaking an assessment or reassessment.

The EOI documents must comprise either:

- One (1) Category A document and two (2) Category B documents, or
- Two (2) Category A documents and one (1) Category B document.
- The category A document must show your full name and date of birth. Certified photocopies will not be accepted.
- All documents must be current unless otherwise stated.
- At least one Category A document must be photographic and show a candidate's full name.
- At least one Category A or B document must show the candidate's signature and date of birth.
