Unit Overview

Working in the construction industry carries inherent risks. For this reason, all workers are required to complete construction induction training, commonly referred to as the White Card course. This training equips individuals with the knowledge and awareness needed to identify workplace hazards, understand legal responsibilities, and prevent injury or illness on construction sites.

This unit of competency focuses on establishing a foundation of Work Health and Safety (WHS) awareness for all workers before entering a construction site. It is a mandatory legal requirement under Queensland legislation for anyone intending to perform construction work in the state.

Under Queensland's WHS laws, anyone carrying out construction work must hold a valid White Card before starting work. This applies to a wide range of construction-related activities, including but not limited to:

- Housing construction
- Civil works
- Renovations and repairs
- Refurbishments
- Asbestos removal
- Bricklaying, concreting, carpentry
- Plumbing and electrical
- Roofing, flooring, and tiling
- Traffic control and road works

White Cards issued in Queensland are nationally recognised and accepted across all Australian states and territories, as part of the National Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work implemented by Safe Work Australia.

This course is designed for:

- New entrants to the construction industry
- Apprentices and trainees
- School-based or pre-employment program participants
- General labourers and tradespeople

Anyone seeking employment on a construction site in Australia

Entry Requirements

To enrol in this course, participants must:

- Be **13 years of age or older**
- Possess or apply for a **USI (Unique Student Identifier)** – [Apply here](#) if you do not already have one
- Provide **three (3) forms of valid ID** (see final page for details)
- Wear **closed-in footwear**
- Successfully complete a short **Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment**

Pre-requisites: None

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Understand **WHS legislative responsibilities** relevant to construction
- Recognise and apply **safe work method statements (SWMS)**
- Identify and control **common physical hazards** on worksites
- Understand **risk management principles** and the **hierarchy of control**
- Select and correctly use **personal protective equipment (PPE)**
- Apply appropriate **emergency procedures**
- Demonstrate an understanding of basic **WHS plans** and procedures

Certification

Upon successful completion of the unit, students will receive:

- A Nationally Recognised Statement of Attainment for:
- CPCWHS1001 – Prepare to Work Safely in the Construction Industry
- A physical Queensland White Card (Construction Induction Card), valid across all Australian jurisdictions.

Resources/Methods of Delivery/Assessment

This course is delivered through a **blend of indoor and outdoor instruction**, combining:

- Structured theory sessions using a **Learner Guide**
- **Visual and physical demonstrations**
- **Written, verbal, and practical assessments**

Participants must complete all assessments to be deemed competent.

Replacement card (section 321 of the WHS regulation)

In the event a person has successfully completed:

- CPCWHS1001 'Prepare to work safely in the construction industry', or
- CPCCOHS1001A 'Work safely in the construction industry' (previous QLD Course);

and the person's card has been declared lost, stolen or destroyed, then the RTO may issue a replacement card upon the card holder supplying a statement of attainment to the RTO and declaring the circumstances in which the card was lost, stolen, or destroyed.

Evidence of identity

At least one category A document must be photographic and show a full name and date of birth (DOB)

A candidate must produce, and an assessor must sight, three matching, original, evidence of identity (EOI) documents before undertaking an assessment or reassessment.

The EOI documents must comprise either:

- One (1) Category A document and two (2) Category B documents, or
- Two (2) Category A documents and one (1) Category B document.
- The category A document must show your full name and date of birth. **Certified photocopies will not be accepted.**
- All documents must be current unless otherwise stated.
- At least one Category A document must be photographic and show a candidate's full name.
- At least one Category A or B document must show the candidate's signature and date of birth.
